Quad City Arts keeps the heart of the festival beating, turning inspiration into opportunity for working artists and students across the community.

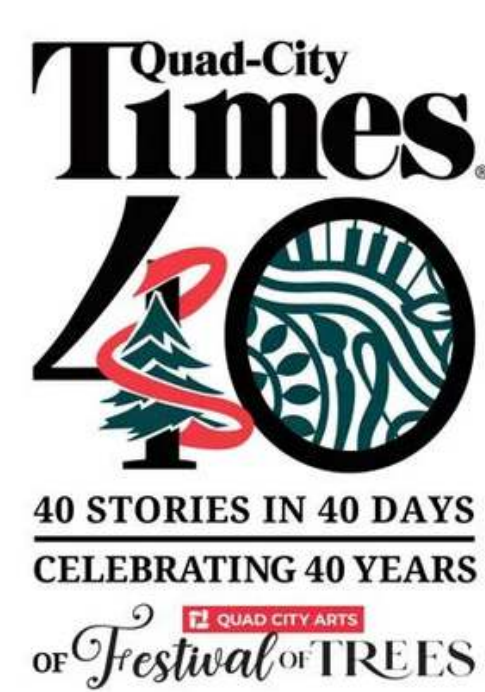
